We must continue to focus on the experience of our players, coaches, officials, clubs and community.

Some key priorities for 2024 include the following to support our strategic agenda:

- 1. Invest into Regional Queensland by establishing a junior program and proper recruitment pathways for our Regional Queensland clubs
- 2. Expand our youth divisions from the current 10–13 age group with a goal to have individual age groups from 6–14 over the next 3–5 years.
- 3. Establish a home for American Football in Queensland by securing the partnership with BSHS at Fursden Rd.
- Continue to support our clubs and coaches with more resources and support to ensure we have strong foundations.


